Public Works

The Public Works Department would like to remind all residents that parking on the District boulevards is not allowed as it hampers the grass cutting.

Please remove all vehicles, recreational vehicles and boats from the lawns. Also, please ensure that all your refuse is placed in a garbage bag and inside a sealed, water tight container with a lid.



Property Tax

The 2017 property tax notices have been mailed out to all home owners. Property Taxes and the Home Owner Grant are due on or before **August 1, 2017**. The Home Owner Grant (HOG) is attached to the bottom portion of your property tax notice. This must be filled out, signed and dropped off or mailed into the District of Port Edward Office prior to the deadline.



In order to claim the HOG, your property must be your main residence. Please note that you are responsible for claiming the Home Owner Grant, even if your taxes are paid through your bank.

A **10% penalty** is applied to all outstanding Property Taxes & overdue Home Owner Grant's after August 1, 2017.

The District does have a drop box on the front door for anyone unable to come into the Municipal Office during business hours. Our business hours are 8:30am—4:30pm, Monday—Friday.

Invasive Plants

Japanese Knotweed

Knotweeds are native to Asia and were introduced to British Columbia as an ornamental plant.



About Knotweeds

Four knotweed species are currently found in British Columbia: Japanese knotweed (*Fallopia japonica*), Giant knotweed (*Fallopia sachalinensis*), Bohemian knotweed (*Fallopia xbohemica*), and Himalayan knotweed (*Polygonum polystachyum*). All four species are similar in appearance, biology, impacts, and distribution.

Why is Japanese Knotweed a problem?

Listed by the World's Conservation Union as one of the world's most invasive species, Japanese knotweed has deep, strong root systems that can do significant damage to concrete foundations, buildings, water and sewer lines, roads, pavement, and retaining walls. It has the potential to grow several meters, over property lines and into neighbouring areas.

What is the best way to remove it?

The plant is resilient to cutting, and is expected to resprout vigorously if cut back. Do not cut back knotweed or move cuttings! This will cause the plant to spread. The most effective method of control is through the application of herbicide. The herbicide must travel through the root system to be effective. The abundance of the plant can be significantly reduced by applying the herbicides 'glyphosate' (commonly known as Roundup), 'imazapyr,' or a combination of both.

It is highly recommended to obtain professional advice and take appropriate safety precautions in the application of herbicides.

What is being done?

The District of Port Edward is currently seeking professionals to deal with this matter and we are encouraging the public to call our office if you suspect that you may have knotweed on your property or to report knotweed on public property. We are compiling information on where knotweed is present in order to address this issue. If you require more information you can visit our website: Knotweed "Tips" or pick up information at our office. The District of Port Edward is working with Northwest Invasive Plant Council on this matter. We require your support by reporting any areas where knotweed is located.
