With winter on the way Public Works, would like to remind everyone that vehicles on the street need to be removed so they can plow and sand. Vehicles left on the road without insurance will be towed at the owners expense.

Just a reminder that garbage day is every Monday, except for holidays. On Tuesday November 14, 2017 all garbage is to be placed in a garbage bag on the curb, in a sealed, water tight container with a lid no later than **8:00 am**. Thank you for your cooperation.

Winter Tires in BC

Rapid changes in elevation and weather can make highway conditions in B.C. unpredictable during the winter. Most B.C. highways have high mountain passes where you are likely to encounter winter weather starting in October. You may start a trip in sunshine but face stretches of slush, ice, heavy snowfall, compact snow or avalanches along the way.



It is the responsibility for the operator of a vehicle to understand the conditions on the roads they regularly drive and equip their vehicle for those conditions to ensure their own safety and the safety of the others on the road. Drive BC is an excellent source for highway conditions and weather forecasts. Drivers must obey winter tire and chain signs throughout the province from October 1 to March 31.

Use four matched winter tires that carry the mountain/snowflake winter tire symbol and with tread no less than 3.5 mm – even when driving a 4 x 4 vehicle.
